SUBJECT: Policy Implications of Soviet Succession

1. I'd like a little talking paper on the policy implications of the succession in the Soviet Union. Who would be likely to:

-- give a higher degree of attention to their economic problems?

-- make concessions to achieve arms control?

-- tone down adventurism in far-off places?

-- be more aggressive in military buildup and in going to far-off places?

-- be sensitive to the internal ethnic minorities, dissident and social problems?
